Preston

I would be grateful if you would convey my thoughts to the parish council regarding the organisation of the Right to Roam march on Saturday, January 21st.

This was an event that was arranged at very short notice and attracted a large number of participants. It was thoughtful towards the local residents in that those attending were requested to not park in the village and where possible to either walk or travel to Cornwood by shuttle buses that were provided to run from Ivybridge. In their planning literature it stressed that Cornwood is a small community and consideration to residents was paramount.

Right to Roam provided stewards to assist the marchers. They had people collecting litter and I believe they also offered to clean the public toilets. Certainly on the following morning of the march, there was no evidence that there had been 3,000 people passing through the Square.

I wonder if as a Parish Council you might feel it appropriate to issue a letter of thanks to Right to Roam. They have thanked us as a community for letting the march take place here. I and neighbours feel that the organisation and consideration by Right to Roam should be acknowledged.
